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CHAPTER 10.32. PARKING

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Sec. 10.32.010. Controlled and regulated parking zones.

The following area within the city is established as a controlled and regulated parking zone: Main Street from Valley Road to 22nd Avenue; East A Street from Valley Road to 21st Avenue; West A Street from Valley Road to 21st Avenue; 19th Avenue from Main Street to East A Street; 20th Avenue from West A Street to East B Street; 21st Avenue from West A Street to East B Street; 22nd Avenue from the alley parallel to and midway between West A Street and Main Street to the alley parallel to and midway between East A Street and Main Street, the area contained within the municipal parking lot located within the city corporate limits.

Sec. 10.32.020. Designated parking spaces to be observed.

All controlled and regulated parking spaces shall have lines or markings painted or placed upon the curb or street adjacent to each controlled and regulated parking area designating the parking space to be used, and each vehicle making use of such parking space shall park within the lines or markings so established. It is unlawful to park any vehicle across any such line or marking or to park a vehicle in such a position that the same shall not be entirely within the space designated by such lines or markings.

Sec. 10.32.040. Duties of chief of police.

It shall be the duty of the chief of police to patrol and enforce the provisions of section 10.32.030 and to keep account of all violations of such section, and to report:

- A. The location of vehicles occupying parking spaces which have been parked in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter;
- B. The license number of such vehicle;
- C. Any other facts, a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such a violation;

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- D. To attach to such vehicle a notice that it has been park in violation of this chapter and instruct the owner or operator to report at the office of the chief of police at the city hall in regard to such violation. such owner or operator may within 24 hours of the time such notice was attached to such vehicle, pay to the chief of police or any other officer in charge at the city hall in full satisfaction of such violation the sum of \$20.00, which shall be remitted by the chief of police to the city clerk, provided, however, that in the event such owner or operator shall fail to pay such sum of \$20.00 within the period of twenty four hours after the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle, the charge for such violation thereafter shall be the sum set by the municipal court which shall be paid by the chief of police or other officer in charge at the city hall.

Sec. 10.32.050. Application and fee for suspension.

Any person, firm or corporation hereafter desiring to suspend the use for public parking within any parking space within a controlled and regulated parking area, shall make application in writing to the chief of police, setting forth in such application the use desired to be made of such parking space or spaces, the number of parking spaces required for such use and the duration of time, including the specific time of commencement and cessation of such special use, and the designation of the specific controlled and regulated parking spaces, which it is desired to use for a special purpose. Such application shall be accompanied by a fee payable to the city, which fee shall be in the amount of \$0.50 for each parking space for which application is made for special use, for each period of eight hours or fraction thereof that such use is to continue.

Sec. 10.32.060. Chief of police to grant or deny permit.

Upon filing of such application, accompanied by the tender of the required fee, the chief of police shall promptly, and in any case within not more than 24 hours from the receipt of such application, grant a permit to the applicant, or give to the applicant notice of his denial of the permit together with his reasons for such denial.

Sec. 10.32.070. Use and purpose for which permits granted.

Permits may be granted by the chief of police, upon application and payment of the prescribed fee as hereinbefore set forth, for the following uses and purposes:

- A. To permit the use of one or more parking spaces by construction workers and construction firms during the actual course of construction, repairing or remodeling of buildings when a building permit for such work has previously been granted by the building inspector of the city;
- B. For the purpose of parking large trucks or moving vans during the course of loading or Unloading large quantities of furniture, fixtures, goods, wares or merchandise, which are not readily loaded or unloaded from normal loading zones already provided;
- C. For the purpose of exhibition by bona fide governmental or nonprofit organizations for a civic or community purpose; provided, however, that in such cases, the application shall be made by the exhibitor and shall be accompanied by a signed consent executed by the owner or operator

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of the business establishment or establishments immediately cent to the designated parking spaces requested;

- D. Reserved.
- E. For such other special uses or purposes as may be, from time to time, approved by the city council.

Sec. 10.32.080. Appeal and procedure when permit denied.

In the event that a permit shall be denied by the chief of police in any case in which an application has been filed and the fee, where required, has been tendered with such application, the applicant may appeal from the decision of the chief of police denying such permit to the city council; and in such case, the city council shall, as soon as conveniently may be done, and in any case not more than five days following the filing of written notice of such appeal with the city clerk, schedule a hearing upon such appeal, and give notice to the applicant of the time and place of such hearing. At the time and place set for hearing, the applicant may appear in person and by counsel and shall be heard regarding the application and the necessity therefore, and after hearing all interested parties upon such appeal, the city council shall grant such permit, or shall refuse to grant the same as shall deem proper to the council based upon the evidence and testimony produced at such hearing, and as shall seem to such council proper under the terms and conditions of this chapter.

Sec. 10.32.090. Violation of article I; penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall utilize one or more parking spaces within a controlled and regulated parking zone in such a manner as to prevent their use by the public for public parking, without having obtained a permit therefore as provided in this shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and Upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed \$750.00 and shall pay cost of prosecution.

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ARTICLE II. OFF-STREET PARKING AREAS

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Sec. 10.32.100. Areas designated for off-street parking.

That portion of Lots 1 and 2 of Block 2 of the First Addition of the city, west of the present city hall building, is designated as an off-street parking area available for the parking of vehicles pursuant to the regulations contained in this article.

Sec. 10.32.110. Mayor to designate prescribed parking; marking and violation.

The mayor is authorized to designate the prescribed parking within the off-street parking area described in the preceding section, by having painted thereon appropriate lines and other signs directing the place and manner of parking vehicles thereon. Every vehicle parking within such off-street parking area shall be parked within the lines or markings so established, and it is unlawful to park any vehicle across any such line or marking or to park a vehicle in such a position that the same shall not be entirely within the space designated by such lines or markings.

Sec. 10.32.120. Designated off-street parking.

The north 30 feet of Lot 17, and all of Lot 18, 19, 20 and 21 of Block 6 of the original city is designated as an off-street parking area available for the parking of vehicles pursuant to the regulations contained in this article.

Sec. 10.32.130. Mayor may authorize parking.

The mayor is authorized to designate the prescribed parking within the off-street parking area described in [section 10.32.120](#), by having painted thereon appropriate lines and other signs and markings directing the place and manner of parking vehicles thereon. Every vehicle parking within such off street parking area shall be parked within the lines or markings so established, and it is unlawful to park any vehicle across any such line or marking or to park a vehicle in such a position that the same shall not be entirely within the space designated by such lines or markings.

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Sec. 10.32.140. Violation of article II; penalty.

Any person violating the provisions of this article shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not sum not to exceed \$750.00 and the costs prosecution.

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ARTICLE III. STREET PARKING

Sec. 10.32.150. Licensed vehicles only; direction.

Only licensed motor vehicles shall be allowed to park on a street or side of the street, and such motor vehicle shall only park in the direction of traffic on that side of the street upon which it is parked.

Sec. 10.32.160. Parking between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

It is unlawful for any person to park any motor vehicle on any public street or in any designated municipal parking lot between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. where posted; provided, however, that this section shall not apply to any employee, worker or employer gainfully employed within a two-block radius of a posted area and that such person is at his place of employment during these hours.
